Public Information

In an emergency you want to be in the know. The best ways to keep track of reliable, up-to-date information on evacuation alerts or evacuation orders is to look to local and provincial authoritative information sources.

Local information is shared through the media and by the Emergency Alert notice found at the top of the City's website. You can sign up to receive the alerts to your mobile device or by email by clicking on the "Notify Me" link.

During an emergency such as a wildfire, an activated EOC will push relevant information out to local and regional media such as Television stations, radio stations, and local print and online media partners.
